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PART II

Narrative Summary

From 1-30 April 1968, the 1st Battalion, 3d Marines participated in Operation NAPOLEON/SALINE within the CUA VIET River Area Complex. The Battalion's overall mission during this period was to deny the enemy access to the river area and ensure uninterrupted traffic thereon. This was accomplished by conducting systematic Company and Platoon Search and Destroy Operations along the south bank of the river and a Battalion (-) Operation to the southeast of the AO. Activity during this period included sightings of small groups of NVA/VC, one engagement with an organized enemy force, and collecting a large quantity of rice from VC controlled areas for delivery to GVN Officials.

Sequential Listing of Significant Events1. Combat Missions Assigned

Basic Mission: NAPOLEON/SALINE

- a. With assigned forces, conduct aggressive ground surveillance, Search and Destroy Operations and Spoiling Attacks in assigned area of operations to ensure uninterrupted traffic on the CUA VIET River and to detect and interdict NVA/VC infiltration routes.
- b. Initially conduct systematic Search and Destroy Operations along south bank of CUA VIET River in area of operations to deny enemy direct fire capability against river traffic.

- d. Be prepared, on order, to extend operations to the southern/western portions of area of operations to deny enemy's capability to deliver indirect fire against river traffic, DONG HA, CUA VIET, and QUANG TRI.

6. Logistics. During the month of April, the four rifle companies and H&S Company (-) were deployed on Operation NAPOLEON/SALINE. During this period, the Battalion maintained a Logistic Support Area (LSA) at (YD 296654). This LSA was established in early March 1968 and was supplied directly from FLSG-B at DONG HA Combat Base, and from a Supply Distribution Point established by the 3d Marines at the mouth of the CUA VIET Waterway. Certain Class I and IV items were provided by the Battalion to one Company OPOCON to the 1st AmTrac and located at C-4. Supplies were transported on the CUA VIET Waterway by LCM-8's and Multi-purpose Parges. Resupply was effected from the LSA by LVTP-5's and OTTER's. The LSA stocked three days Class I, seven days Class II (gasoline), and five days Class V.

7. Supply. During the month of April, 159 Requisitions were submitted. Of these, 67 were filled and 43 were cancelled.

8. Motor Transport. Motor Transport maintenance continued to be excellent during this period. The one continuing problem was the shortage of starters for the M274A2. The deadling rate for the month of April was 21%, with the majority of the vehicles deadlined being M274A2's.

11. Intelligence. During the month of April intelligence reports indicated the elements of the 808th and 314th NVA Regiments were operating in the southeastern corner of the AO. Contact was made with one of these units on 17 April 1968 at (YD 350647) in the Le Xuyen area. This was the only major enemy contact for the month. Sniper activity was confined to the eastern and southeastern sections of the AO, around the villages of Bo Bang (YD 335627), Le Xuyen (YD 345633) and An Trach (YD 354623). Numerous surprise firing devices were encountered in Bo Bang (YD 335623) in the area north of Le Xuyen (YD 340646, 340648, 353640) and in the area between Le Xuyen and An Trach (YD 346628, 248626, 350628, 354627, 355641). When the AO was extended south, it was noted that the number of surprise firing devices increased in Than Ley Quang (YD 365615) and Than Lang Quang (YD 375602). Liaison with the Trieu Phong District Headquarters enabled this organization to utilize Popular Forces in conjunction with patrols and night activities. There were four interpreters, and six "Kit Carson" Scouts attached to the Battalion during the month of April 1968.

- (1) The first resupply will be effected at 1700 on D+1 and daily thereafter for Companies C and D.
- (2) Resupply of water is not anticipated.
- (3) Company C will be supplied 3 MCI's per man on D+1.
- (4) Resupply request for Class II and IV items will be submitted prior to 1200 on the day preceding resupply.
- (5) Resupply request for Class I and V items will be submitted prior to 0900 on the day of resupply.
- (6) Resupply requests will be sent to the S-4 via the Battalion Administrative Net (63-75).
- (7) Normal resupply will be by LVTP-5 if possible; otherwise, by helicopter.
- (8) For helicopter resupply, TACR personnel will control the helicopters on TACR Local Net.
- (9) Helicopter resupplies will be by external lifts.
- (10) Be prepared to mark LZ with panels or smoke.

e. Uniforms and Equipment. Normal arms and equipment to include flak jacket, gas mask, and light marching pack.

f. Prescribed Load

- (1) Class I Companies C and D 3 MCI's per man. Company B 6 MCI's per man.
- (2) Class II essential items only (ie, normal arms and equipment).
- (3) Class V basic allowance plus one day of ammunition. Also, a minimum of four smoke grenades per squad.

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2. EVACUATION AND MEDICAL SUPPORT:
 - a. All Emergency and Priority medevacs will be effected by TACI.
 - b. Routine medevacs will be effected by helicopter if possible; if not, routine medevacs will be transported via the Battalion Administrative Jet.
 - c. All casualty reports will be submitted via the Battalion Administrative Jet without delay.
 - d. Evacuation of weapons and communication equipment will be accompanied by a courier.
3. TRANSPORTATION. The following vehicles will be available for transporting personnel and equipment:

5 LVTP-5's	-	located at Battalion LSA
4 Others	-	located at Battalion LSA
10 LVTH-5's	-	attached to Company D
4. SERVICES:
 - a. Normal maintenance procedures will be in effect.
 - b. A limited number of clean utilities will be available if required.
5. PERSONNEL:
 - a. Prisoners of War. All POW's will be evacuated to the S-2 without delay.
